# **COMPOSER'S NOTE**

It often feels a bit like Sisyphus to be a new musical theater writer. You try to keep writing new shows, rewriting old ones, putting passion and unpaid labor, and all you have into projects that take years and years, only to feel as though the ball rolls back down the hill each time someone passes on producing your work or you shelve a show before it's ever gotten a production. You keep going, because it's what you love more than anything, and you keep believing that one day your time will come, but each subsequent rejection can chip away at that resolve bit by bit. Not to mention the cost of fruitless labor chipping away at your checking account.

But then out of the blue, the theater gods give you a sign that you're doing something right, a "here's looking at you kid," and it is the most spectacular feeling you can imagine. I've been pursuing theater composing for over a decade, so to receive the Jonathan Larson Grant, and to be able to finally celebrate it at Jonathan's Alma Mater, is truly a gift. After growing up with Jonathan's words and music as the soundtrack to my childhood, it's an honor to be sharing my own work in his name. The angst, compassion, curiosity, and challenging of the status quo in his work inspired me to create bold musical storytelling in my own voice. Jonathan's work taught me to love every character I compose for, to love them for their flaws as much as their dreams. I'm grateful to Adelphi University for continuing to celebrate his legacy, and I'm honored to be a part of it. Today truly feels like a day where the ball isn't rolling down the hill. So cheers to Jonathan! To Musical Theater! "To days of inspiration... making something out of nothing, the need to express... to going against the grain, going insane, going mad... to La Vie Boheme."

Benjamin Velez (Jonathan Larson Grant Recipient, Composer, Co-Producer, Soloist) Benjamin Velez is a composer/lyricist and Columbia graduate (114th Varsity Show), born and raised in Miami, FL. Proud member of the Advanced BMI workshop (2012 Harrington Award), his work has been at MTF, Ars Nova, NAMT, NEO, the Civilians, 4@15, and Joe's Pub. He was a Sundance Artist at the UCROSS Foundation, and his musical Afterland, written with Katie Hathaway, was developed at the Yale Institute for Music Theater and the York Theater. He developed Starblasters (now Boomerangs) (also with Hathaway) at Dixon Place and Manhattan School of Music (2021). His musical Borderline, written with Aryanna Garber, won the 2018 Weston Playhouse New Musical Award, and opened the 2019 O'Neill Musical Theater Conference. He was a 2018-2019 Dramatist Guild Foundation Fellow, the 2019 Fred Ebb Award Winner, a 2020 Thom Thomas Award winner, and a 2020 Jonathan Larson Grant recipient. His musical Kiss My Aztec, written with John Leguizamo, Tony Taccone, and David Kamp, was developed at the Public Theater (2018), before premiering at Berkeley Rep (2019), followed by a run at the La Jolla Playhouse (2019). It will have its east coast premiere in June 2022. Benjamin is under commission by La Jolla Playhouse for an original musical he's writing with Harrison David Rivers.

Florrie Bagel (Soloist) Florrie Bagel made her Broadway debut in *The Rose Tattoo* with Roundabout Theatre Company. By creating the Tony Awards, developing educational programs and distributing thousands of dollars of grants and awards each year, the American Theatre Wing is dedicated to preserving the past, celebrating the present and fostering the future of American theater nationwide. The Jonathan Larson Grants are a major part of that work, celebrating the standards of tomorrow by supporting the songwriters of today. New musical writers are pushing the envelope of convention and infusing musical theater with contemporary, joyful urban vitality. Endowed with leadership support by Jonathan Larson's family, this program provides financial support, recognition and residency opportunities that invest in the changing landscape of the American musical, one writer at a time.

Since 2015, the Larson Legacy Concert Series at the Adelphi PAC has celebrated the next generation of artists at the college home of the creator of the Pulitzer Prize-winning musical RENT, Jonathan Larson '82. Each year, the American Theatre Wing presents emerging creators of musical theater with the Jonathan Larson Grants. Select recipients of these grants are showcased at the Adelphi PAC in this series to help nurture and support the next generation of creative artists to carry on Jonathan Larson's legacy. Past recipients of these grants have gone on to create the Broadway musicals Dear Evan Hansen, Natasha, Pierre and the Great Comet of 1812, A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder, Grey Gardens, Next To Normal, Elf, Hands on a Hardbody, Be More Chill and many more.
